



Camp Creek Outfall Capacity Relief Project

Project Overview:

The Camp Creek Outfall follows the north fork of Camp Creek and begins near Greenbriar Parkway and ends at the Atlanta City limits. Within the city limits, the Camp Creek Outfall collects wastewater from outfalls located in the eastern, southern, and central portions of the basin and drains into the Fulton County Camp Creek Interceptor. The outfall also collects wastewater from the western portion of the City of East Point.

Project Description:

The scope of the project is to replace and rehabilitate designated sewer outfalls in the Camp Creek basin to allow for sufficient capacity relief. Significant project components include sewer replacement for the North Fork Camp Creek Outfall and sewer replacement and inline storage for the Camp Creek Outfall. The North Fork sewer lines will be replaced with 18-inch diameter pipes measuring approximately 1,600 linear feet. The proposed Camp Creek Outfall sewer lines will be replaced with pipes ranging from 10 to 24 inches in diameter and equaling a total length of approximately 5,200 linear feet.

Open-cut will serve as the primary method of installation except at the creek crossing and Interstate 285 intersection. At the I-285 crossing, the Department will use a combination of jack-and-bore or pipe-bursting along with open-cut method. Currently DWM is performing Sewer System Evaluation Survey (SSES) and Sewer Rehabilitation in the area.

Project Impacts:

Residents and businesses may experience lane closures during the construction phase as well as construction-related noise and dust.

Project Location:

The sewer lines to be replaced take flow from the eastern side of I-285 to the west of the interstate just north of the Camp Creek Parkway exit. The project is divided into two main segments. The main part of the project starts along Rivera Drive in the Park at Greenbriar Apartments which is located south of Greenbriar Mall. The lines follow the path of Stone Creek past the Continental Colony Elementary School ultimately passing under Hogan Road, the Stone Hogan Connector and I-285. The second segment of the project replaces a line which takes flow from the City of East Point. This segment originates at the boundary of the City of East Point and the City of Atlanta north of the Stone Hogan Park. It flows the along Camp Creek and meets the main line at the just east of the Stone Hogan Connector.
